

Who We Are


PNAS, the official journal of the US National Academy of Sciences, is an authoritative source of high-impact, original research that broadly spans the biological, physical, and social sciences. The journal is published weekly in print and daily online in PNAS Early Edition.



The National Academy of Sciences is an honorific society comprising approximately 2,100 members and 350 foreign associates, of whom 200 are Nobel laureates. New members are elected annually in recognition of their distinguished research achievements, and election is considered one of the highest honors that can be accorded a scientist or engineer. All papers in PNAS have the seal of approval of an Academy member.




